THE WATERSIDE MEETING was

held on February 15 at the Club with very good attendance. We received updates from several members of the committee as follows.



GM Michael Ciaccio has sent bids to several contractors for the repair of our sea walls that

need to be maintained with no major repairs needed. Several of our contractors have so much new business that they declined to do any repairs at this time. We discussed that if no one returns a bid we will ask whoever is selected to repair and replace our docks, we would include the sea wall maintenance to the work order as well.

Steve Ekovich updated the committee on financing options and the finance committee, Board of Directors, and Trustees will have to select from for the financing of club repairs and replacements. We have received reasonable rates and terms for our projects.

John Minton presented our update from Woods Consulting. We will meet with the county on Friday April 18 to discuss various differences between the original permits and our current docks. Woods consulting held a meeting with good results on some small variations and a concern about the contractor we used for the emergency repairs to our marina. The permit was not completed by the contractor. We believe this will not affect the permits we hope to receive in the next couple of weeks.

We had a good discussion about appropriate flags to be flown in our marina and agreed unanimously not to allow any vulgar language or pictures.

Our Cruiser and Yachting groups continue to be very active, representing CYC around the state and country. The Cruisers have organized excursions to other clubs and marinas around the state. Yachting is of course promoting, sponsoring, and conducting great sailing races scheduled this year, bringing in sailors from all over the country.



2022 Sunfish Internationals

IN LIKE A LION, out like a bigger lion is how this event was described in the trade publications. Paul-Jon Patin won his third Sunfish International Masters Championship, held March 13-15 in the Gulf just North of Clearwater Pass. With 68 boats, all competitors were over the age of 40 and nearly a third of the fleet were women. Following a strong storm system, Day 1 of the event began with not-exactly-spring-break-conditions with temps in the 30s. CYC Race Committee was thrilled to be greeted by hot coffee and Chef Jermaine's delicious cinnamon buns to start the day.

Conditions moderated somewhat for Day 2 as PRO Rick Lillie from Naples, FL led the CYC race committee in running four races in 10-18 kts of wind on relatively flat water. Competitors launched from CCSC for the final day expecting

> similar conditions as day before but unexpectedly strong windssustained low 20's; gusting to 33 allowed for 2 races to close out the event.

Each day, CYC managed 25 volunteers on the water, led by event organizer Kelley Lesperance, PRO Rick Lillie and volunteer coordinator PC TIm Roberts, along with over 10 volunteers each day land-side, led by Lynne Shackelford.

This group also enjoyed a Welcome Reception and Taco dinner in the dry dock on 3/12, organized by PC Tish Wold.


gather around 10:30 am, enjoy the fashion show and then lunch. Make your reservations now and let the office know your menu choice.


We hope everyone enjoyed this past month's activities and are well rested after that "31 day March" (cue chuckle)! The Club started off






So, as we move into the spring I would like to wish you and your family the best of health and happiness.
