BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The BOD took the following actions at the December 16 meeting:

- Received reports from the General Manager, Treasurer/Finance, House and Grounds, Waterside, Capital Improvements, Yachting, Membership, Entertainment and FCYC and COMPASS representatives.
- Approved the recommendation from the Finance Task Force, who were charged with exploring the dock improvement financing plan: Immediately market the Transfer of Development Rights (TDRs) (retaining 7-10 of the 27 units available), limit use of Capital Funds to \$250,000, and utilize a bridge loan to finance dock until we get \$ from TDRs.
- Approved the 2022 Budget as presented
- Approved 5 new members, 1 membership status change, 3 resignations and 1 LOA request.

The next meeting will be held January 20.

Race Committee at Clearwater Yacht Club

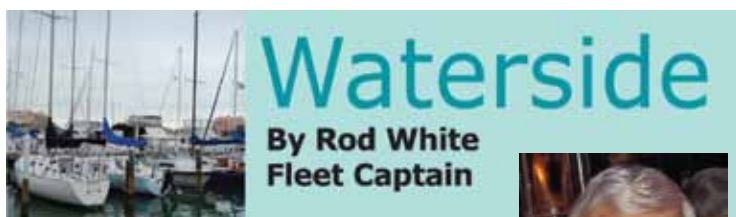

THE WATERSIDE COMMITTEE

met one week earlier on Tuesday, December 14 due to the holidays. We discussed slip lease rules and fees for the upcoming year. Phil Shaw, our Club Treasurer, updated the committee on the financing plans the Board and Trustees are discussing. We also discussed a Woods Consulting update from Terri Skapik, President, as follows.



1. Dock Office on Dock B—wreck and remove (not to be rebuilt).
2. Contractor bids—are scheduled to go out December

16, however, Pinellas County has not issued their commercial dock permit yet (a result of delay on Clearwater providing municipal approval). We continue waiting on that. A copy of the contractor bid packages will be provided for review prior to distribution.

3. A separate Army Corps permit is required as both the FDEP and County did not or will not use their delegation of authority for granting federal approvals. A separate Corps permit application is being filed but will not hold up contractor bids from going out. Corps authorization is required prior to construction commencement.

After discussions with Waterside and the Board of Directors we decided to ask Terri to quote repair and replace the Dock office due to WIFI usage, parades, Blessing of the Fleet and the unique structure on our docks.

All guest and slip holders please be aware of appropriate flag display and etiquette in our marina.

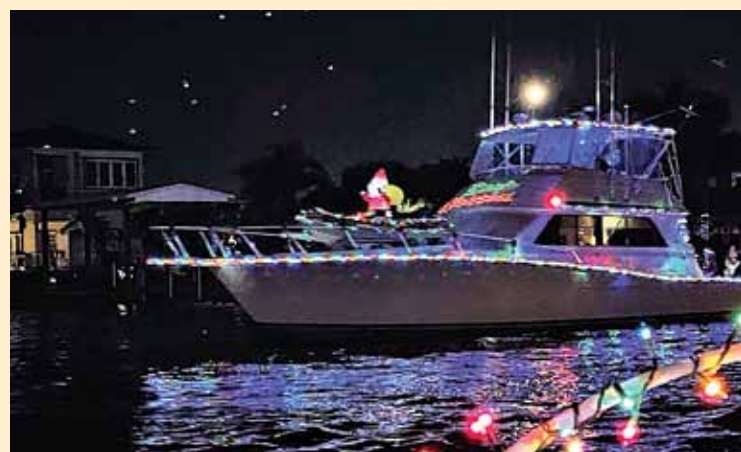

Who knows what the future may bring? None of us, but the wisdom of a thousand generations reminds us that in no small way, the future we will experience, both in our personal relationships and in our time on the water, is being written each and every day through the choices we make, the words we speak, and the prudent seamanship we exercise. 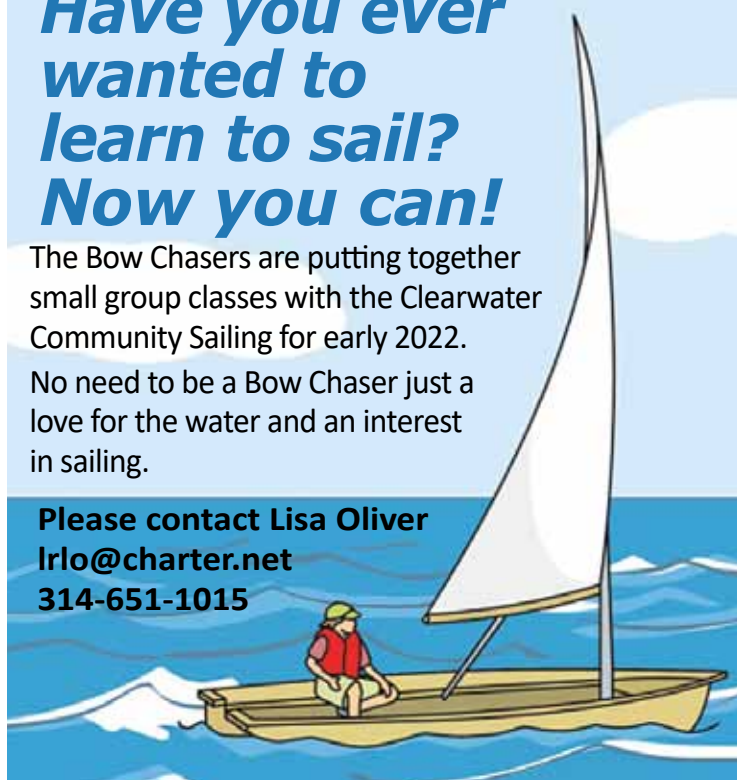
