Into the future. . .



Town Hall Meeting

IT IS REFRESHING to experience an organization with exceptional management being totally open and honest. The principal players in Wednesday's Town Hall were Commodore Crist, Vice Commodore Curtis Wold, Treasurer, Richard Libonate and Club Manager, Michael Ciaccio.

Under the same backdrop of honesty, the "Town Hall" held April 27 in the Drydock was more a "State of the Union"; still, it was important for CYC members to hear the contrast drawn between where we were a year ago and the future we face.

Each presenter showed in detail how bleak last year was (and yes, there was red ink involved). The overall presentation maintained a positive, upbeat attitude about now and CYC's future outlook. Some positives emerged: the Florida Council of Yacht Clubs (FCYC) is investigating the possibility of offering insurance to FCYC members to help offset the dramatic increases coming in property insurance.

Yes, last year's attendance numbers were down, but they are improving as Covid fears continue to subside. The improvements we see are largely a result of increased membership and dramatic new activities, programs and entertainment. Compliments of Amie Crosby (Membership) and Jim Hannigan/Tom Cummings (Entertainment co-Chairs) respectively.

The 'Town Hall' led immediately to a lengthy discussion of the imminent marina construction and refurbishing of the ground level, not unimportant since we will be spending approximately \$1.5 million in 2022/23. The few questions centered on the future of the Clubhouse and plans for the property expansion. Commodore Crist emphasized the importance of financial responsibility; CYC simply cannot afford to tackle that magnitude of a project at this time.

This led to mentions of the typical, perennial problems CYC and every business faces--inflation of both labor and materials, minimum purchase requirements, club reciprocity, staffing. These will be addressed as the year continues.

The evening concluded with a scrumptious Mexican buffet prepared by Jermaine Bass and staff.

Here are some updates on a few of the projects going on at the Club:

- Taver Bayly Dining Room and Grill: Sub-committee (Christy Crist, RC Rich Libonate, PC Tim Roberts, Joan Carter). Getting bids for hotel/hospitality quality carpet rolls for where the tables are in the dining room and grill and luxury vinyl plank (LVP) flooring for Grill walkway, Grill bathrooms, entry, bathroom hallway and dance floor. Additional painting where needed with light and bright colors. Re-Formica bar. Tiki Bar refresh. Thanks to Phyllis Nordman (and Colleen Egan, PC Andy Spetz, Ritchie Shaw) for cleaning, painting the posts and outside fascia and polishing.
- Fifteen new umbrellas and two cantilever umbrellas were purchased for the Tiki Deck and pool to give a refreshed, consistent look in navy blue.

- Repair Boat Shed. PC Tim Roberts and VC Curtis Wold are coordinating with BowChasers and Indian Rocks Family Sailing Association (IRFSA) to inventory and then purchase materials for a members' workday and clean the shed, repair the sides, and get bids for roofers.
- Dry Dock Furniture. Jim Crist volunteered labor to reupholster with gray vinyl and white base for thirty two chairs.

As a reminder, if you do not have a CYC burgee window cling on your windshield, please pick one up in the office. It helps us to ensure that cars parked in the parking lot, especially for longer durations, belong to members. Thanks!!


