**IF YOU HAVE** visited the Club in the last few days, you have seen our contractors are in full commitment to replacing our docks. We are very

fortunate to have the contractors we have due to long lead times for product we need to replace our docks with.

We are still waiting for Duke Energy to supply our new power, and lead times for some of the electrical components is out into 2023. We will be using our current power and pedestals until the new ones arrive.

September 19 began the removal of B dock and the Crows Nest. If you look at the bottom of this page, you'll see a couple of weird black and white blocks. They are called QR codes. They are just a quick and dirty way of getting to an internet address without memorizing all those www's etc. If your smart phone has a camera, aim it at either QR code. Thanks to Jim Donnell, we recorded the demolition of the old Crows Nest in time lapse and regular time. If technology gods are in alignment, you should be able to see exactly how that all went down (no pun intended). We hope to have A dock completely re-powered by the end October. Please be very careful when walking around the Club we are a construction zone with docks, painting of the building and parking lot storage areas.

We hope to have the docks replaced by the end of November and the new electricals soon after.




# In Memorium



- **1977** Members Margaret Hanselman, Connie Aylward and Helen Eckhoff formulated a plan for a group to promote friendship and to support the Club as needed. The By-Laws were accepted in February, 1977. Ann Cornett (daughter of Taver Bayly, Past Commodore (1933-1940) and namesake of our Main Dining Room) wrote the script for installation of officers.
- **1977** That first year served coffee and donuts at the Snipes and Kahlua Cup Regattas and have assisted in the Club's regattas over the years. This also was the start of fund raising money for special projects by events such as auctions, dock sales, raffles, luncheons, and our Annual Holiday Boatique.
- **1981** Started the Fund that resulted in the Memorial Garden and is still maintained by the Gulls at the Club.



She spoke on the origin of the Clark Mills prams which was also called the Clearwater pram sailing dinghy. The Clark Mills pram was originally designed to be built by a father and son and then later sailed by the son. Rumored to be made by one 4'x8' sheet of marine plywood, I always was told it was made from TWO, one for the sides and one for the floor and centerboard. Be that as it may, the prams were originally







designed for a child, usually under 120 pounds. As you can see the pictures of those of us who sail these little itty-bitty boats, we are neither children nor under 120 pounds. There never was a patent for the design because it was built to affordably encourage sailing. The Clearwater yacht club has some of the best condition prams in our local sailing competitions.
