

Happy New Year! Welcome to a new year of boating and our newly renovated marina at CYC. First, I'd like to thank the outgoing Fleet Captain Rod White, for his invaluable

contributions and for his partnership in the renovation project. We certainly gained a whole lot of experience and education in marina building and even had a few laughs along the way.

Our construction partner Waterline Construction owned by Pat Hecker and new CYC member could not have done a better job. What was worn and falling apart is now a freshly built and solid marina that will outlast us all. The primary construction was completed on December 13 with only the floating dock to go and, it should be installed in Januarry/February. By the time they come back to install them, we should have a list of last-minute fixes that need attention.

Our electrical contractor Phillips Solutions, owned by Joe Phillips, fellow CYC member, faced an enormous challenge of wiring the marina with our existing electric and old pedestals until Duke Energy separates and installs new power. Once the new power is installed, which is planned for Dec/Jan, Phillips will be able to install our new pedestals hopefully by late January.

As we wait for the finishing touches it is important to remember we cannot modify or make any changes to the new docks until we have received final permits from the governing authorities. Unfortunately, there is no way to forecast when the inspection will occur. Stay tuned.

Now that the bulk of the project draws to completion, I can begin to focus on my duties as Fleet Captain. I look forward to working with my newly appointed Waterside Committee to making our marina the best in our area. We plan to meet one time per month during the week of the Board Meetings. On the current calendar, we're shown as January 14 at 6 pm, in conjunction with Yachting. That may change so be on the lookout for our meeting announcement in Constant Contact if you care to attend. We eagerly welcome all able volunteers with open arms.

AcRecipe From the Chef

Fresh Basil & Romano marinated Roma **Tomatoes with Prosciutto** di Parma & Lemon Aioli **Ingredients:**



1 ea Small red onion, finely chopped

4 c. Ice water

1/2 c. Balsamic vinegar

1/4 c. Olive oil

2 tsp. Sugar

1/2 tsp. Salt

1/2 tsp. Pepper

2 ea Garlic cloves, chopped

1/2 c. Fresh basil chiffonade

6 ea Roma tomatoes, wedged

1/2 c. Fresh parsley, chopped Shaved Romano for garnish

Directions:

- 1. Mix onions in ice water. Drain and pat dry with paper
- 2. Whisk together vinegar, olive oil, two tablespoons water, sugar, salt, pepper, and garlic. Stir in basil and parsley. Add tomato wedges and chopped onions. Set aside for 10 minutes.
- 3. Serve on plates over prosciutto. Garnish with Romano.
