GREETINGS FROM THE MARINA

Unfortunately, not much has changed since last month's communication, i.e.: no breaking news! That said, supply chain issues, especially with

electrical equipment, continue to hinder our efforts to complete the project. Thankfully, these issues haven't caused any catastrophic failures, but new and reliable power as well as new dock pedestals will help us avoid any "what-ifs."

We've been advised our pedestals will ship March 25th. Add to that another month for installation which means to expect completion by early to mid-May--if we're lucky! Hopefully, by then we'll receive our remaining electrical supplies and conclude with Duke Energy and the ever-demanding permitting authorities.

Good News Dept.: Waterline Construction, our contractor, has completed construction of the marina including installation of our new floating dock. As a result, our marina is 100 percent occupied; all leases have been signed. As permitting agencies conclude their inspections, we'll be focused on the finishing touches, including home-approved grab bars/handrails, step downs, ladders, and attractive deck lighting.

Please permit me to remind everyone--sailors and cruisers alike-that we now have a full-time Dock Master. Austin Danner. As Clearwater Yacht Club members, it's customary to show our appreciation for a job well done, especially when he goes the extra mile for large-scale events and assists us personally.

In today's environment it's become so difficult to obtain hard working employees, but we've been more than fortunate to have Austin aboard as our new Dock Master. We must show our appreciation to keep him here for a long time. Lastly, Austin completed and passed all requirements and testing for the captain certificate by the US Coast Guard. Please make sure you congratulate Captain Austin!

ARecipe From the Chef

Yummy in the Tummy

Balsamic Braised Short Ribs with Roasted Parsnip & Rosemary Puree Ingredients:

15 lbs Short ribs, trimmed and portioned to 8 oz Salt and freshly cracked black pepper

- 8 C. Onion, chopped
- 4 C. Celery, chopped
- 4 C. Carrots, chopped
- 1 C. Garlic, chopped
- 1/2 C. Chicken broth
- 2 C.
- Balsamic vinegar
- 2 C. Stout beer
- 1 C. **Brown Sugar**
- 2 C. Tomato, chopped



- 1. Season short ribs. Sear on all sides until very well carmelized. Add vegetables and sweat
- 2. Add vinegar and beer and reduce by half. Add stock, sugar and tomato, then add all ingredients to 4" hotel pan. Bring to simmer on burner covered with foil.
- 3. Cook in 500° oven two and a half to three hours or until tender. Remove short ribs and reduce pan to a glaze consistency.

cruise concluded on Friday but gave an option to stay the weekend boosting the trip to 5 days for 10 boats.



and everywhere in-between.


