Right now there are scads of different "classes," just like regular full scale racing. As sailors know, in full scale racing there are VERY specific rules for mingling different yachts racing together. It is called PHRF rating; it's a way of making adjustments to boats so, from a

racing perspective, they all "look" the same and their scores are apples to apples comparable.

Freedom Lake avoids all this confusion by separating each boat class by designating certain days for DF-95 races, others for Laser class (not to be confused with full scale Lasers). On any specific day, they operate strict oneclass races.

What went on since the

last Compass article is that ABC News got wind of Freedom Lake regattas and showed up for some background video images (called B-roll) for a story they featured.

The photos in this article show all kinds of different sized RC craft. Normally they would not be in the water together, they were that day strictly for the cameras. It does make for some great B-roll!



ARecipe From the Chef

Yummy in the Tummy

FRANGELICO PANNA COTTA

Ingredients:

2 cups Whipping cream, divided 1 tsp Unflavored gelatin

 $1^{1}/_{3}$ cup Sour Cream

1/2 cup+2 tbsp Sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp Vanilla extract $1^{1}/_{2}$ cups Fresh berries

2 tbsp Cracked black peppercorns

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Frangelico

Directions:

- 1. Pour half cup whipping cream in a small saucepan. Sprinkle gelatin over cream and let stand for 15 min.
- 2. Stir in remaining whipping cream, sour cream, and half cup sugar in medium-sized pan over medium heat until sugar dissolves and mix comes to a low boil. Remove from heat. Cover and hold for 5 min. Strain into bowl.
- 3. Stir in gelatin mix over low heat until dissolved. Add Frangelico and vanilla. Divide mix into aluminum cups.
- 4. Mix berries, peppercorns and two tablespoons sugar in bowl and toss to blend. Serve over panna cotta and serve.
