

The CYC Board of Directors (BOD) met on August 17. The following items were addressed:

- The Members Only page on the website is now active. You have received the password in an email. Once you log in, you can find the Club Bylaws, Policies, and Roster. You can also make dining and event reservations!
- The Board approved the appointment of members of the Nominating Committee for 2023. In coordination with Immediate Past Commodore, Greg Crist (as chair) and Leader Development Committee Chair, John Minton, the Board approved three additional members: Craig Bleakley, Steve Hitchcock and Dick Nordman. - In an effort to mitigate the significant increases in insurance, CYC will join with other clubs in Phase I of the Florida Council of Yacht Clubs (FCYC) Group Insurance Program Initiative. Phase I will involve data collection from each club, wind modeling and analyzation of the data, and a market viability study, to determine which group program is best for our clubs to start before hurricane season 2024.
- The Board approved one new Summer Membership and one new Full Membership. We also had some resignations: three Full memberships and two Summer memberships. Look for our Burgee Flag on the tables and, be sure to welcome our newest members!

This boating certificate class offers an in-depth and interesting boating safety course, and provides the knowledge needed to obtain a boating certificate from the State of Florida. Some insurance companies will also offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete this course. So, be on the lookout for more information regarding this class.






























#### CYC Annual Blessing of our Pets Sunday October 8th – 1 pm



YOUR HOUSE AND Grounds Committee has accomplished quite a bit this year thanks to the hard work and efforts of the entire Committee, as well as our staff. The members of the Committee include Commodore Curtis Wold, Rear Commodore Joan Carter, Phyllis Nordman, Jim Hannigan,

We are at a point where we are down to just a few smaller projects with the exception of repaving the parking lot as well as completing the landscaping. Both of these will be commenced once Duke Energy finishes their work on the docks.

I am sure you have noticed the beautiful new Dinnerware, Flatware and Glassware which complement all the upgrades to both the Main Dining and Grill Rooms. A special thanks goes to a Member who donated all the Glassware with several styles to be etched with the CYC Logo in the coming months. You may also notice the staff wearing white gloves as they polish the flatware and glassware while setting the tables, thanks to the direction of our GM, Peter Jutis.

While there are many positive things going on at our Club, there are a couple of unpleasant points I would like to bring up, and they have to do with costs. Every member has seen costs rise over the past couple years in every aspect of our daily lives from the grocery store to utilities to fuel. There is one area, however, which has impacted everyone of us and that is insurance. We have recently received our renewal policies, and our wind insurance increased 110% to \$105,000 annually with other policies increasing between 6% and 10%. This equates to almost a \$15 increase per member per month going forward.

Just as with our personal lives, these are costs that are totally out of our control. On top of insurance, our utilities have increased over 45% just in the last two years. I can assure you, the staff and Board are looking for ways to reduce expenses while continuing to give our members the amenities they deserve. We raise these issues, so everyone is aware of the environment we are working in. Ultimately and unfortunately, these costs will have to reflect back to our members, at some point, in the form of membership dues. Please remember, we are attempting to do everything in our power to keep costs down in all areas, as our goal continues to give our Members the best experience possible.

Most importantly, thank you for being a member of the Clearwater Yacht Club. Please come and enjoy our great events and wonderful food and service, in a great environment.

# ARecipe From the Chef

#### **By Chef Jermaine Bass**

#### **Creamy Bourbon Chicken** with Fried Sweet Plantains & Lime Drizzle

#### **Ingredients:**

6 ea Boneless, skinless chicken breast

halves

Salt & Pepper to taste

1/2 c All purpose flour

Butter 3 tbsp

2 tbsp Olive oil

2 ea Green onions

1/2 c **Bourbon** 

8 oz Mushrooms, sliced

1 c Heavy cream

1/2 c Vegetable oil

4 ea Very ripe plantains (about 1/4 pound each), peeled

and cut diagonally into 1/2" slices

Salt to taste

2 ea Limes, cut into wedges

#### **Directions:**

#### **FOR CREAMY BOURBON CHICKEN**

- 1. Sprinkle chicken breasts with salt & pepper. Lightly dust with flour and set aside.
- 2. Heat butter and olive oil in a large, heavy skillet over low heat. Add chicken pieces and chopped green onions. Saute, turn frequently, until chicken is golden brown and tender, about 15-20 minutes.
- 3. While chicken cooks, baste with a few spoonfuls of bourbon every few minutes, adding in very small batches so liquid cooks off while chicken cooks and does not accumulate in pan. When chicken is cooked through and golden brown, transfer to warm platter.
- 4. Add sliced mushrooms to skillet and saute, stirring constantly, about three minutes. Add heavy cream to mushrooms and scrape loose browned bits that may be stuck to skillet.
- 5. Simmer until mixture is hot and begins to thicken. Adjust to taste with salt and pepper, then pour sauce over chicken.

#### FOR FRIED PLANTAINS

- 1. Heat oil in a heavy duty skillet over high heat. Add four or five plantain slices in a single layer and cook until golden brown and tender, about four to six minutes per side. Transfer to plate lined with paper towels. Repeat with the remaining plantain slices.
- 2. Sprinkle cooked plantains with salt and drizzle with lime.

#### Serves 6

### From the Front Office

#### WHAT'S HAPPENED SINCE

first appeared, I'm still waiting on everything to come in—the espresso machine, the cappuccino machine. We've replaced our coffee supplier, so the coffee is different but the new machines are in the warehouse. Of course, when they arrive, they have to be installed. They are all part of the process.



I think we're getting better every day. I keep hearing a lot of positive comments. Bit by bit, everything I do is going to be the best for the Club, the drinks, the cocktails, menus.



People complained the new glassware was different, it's new but the drinks aren't!

The glasses are almost exactly the same. The new glasses we have are just a hair bigger than the old glasses they look smaller but it a perception thing.

The old martini glasses

were thicker, new ones are thinner--it makes it look like the old ones are bigger but it's a perception thing.

The bartenders pour booz into the glass and shake it. They pour it into the martini glass to the rim. There's still alcohol in the tin; now they're throwing the tin away. That's costing members and me as a manager money, because we're throwing alcohol away.

My objective is to make them pour properly so that you get your great drink, great price full drink but the tin is empty, so that we're not wasting that ounce or two of alcohol. Say we make 50 drinks a night, that's 50 oz of booze! It costs us money. It costs, and everything has to go up.

Jermaine's food is better than ever. He has so much passion for his specials and his food, everything else just didn't get the same attention. A hamburger is just a hamburger. We talked and Jermaine agrees; now it's not just a hamburger, it's our food. Everything that comes out of the kitchen has his name attached to it. It has my name attached to it too. It better be good.

Our cooks are learning how to cook his food, the way we want it. It's not just a hamburger, it's a great burger! That's my goal.

Going forward, Jermaine's on board. We're going to work on the big events, like pasta night—we're going to get better. Right now it's not done to the potential we need to be.

The servers are getting better; the cooks are getting better. They're starting to buy into the incremental changes we're instituting, feed into the Kool-Aid, feed into what my goal is. I'm loving it!!.

Other things are in place but they're not there yet; glass-

ware, we 're waiting on our wine glasses, our Old Fashion glasses, they're all getting etched and should be here in the next 5-6 weeks Everything in due time.

We're cleaner, more organized. The Gulls Nest for instance, we're going to get that organized, cleaned. Get the wine, the water, the plates, the silverware, out of there. We're also going to clear that shed too, there's old kitchen stuff, the stuff from under the staircase, all in the shed.

We want to preserve our history. A lot of the pictures--they reframed and they are now hanging around the Club I'll throw out an old computer that's been sitting back there unused for 15 years or an old ice machine—no use storing old, useless stuff. We're donating some vases; half of the shed is full of old notebooks, most of them empty.

Going forward we're getting more modern too with a new computer system, a new inventory system, everything on the "Cloud" and server based. You don't have to look at a binder to search a book to see what sales we had. We should be able to look on a database, knowing the date, we should be able to see how many hamburgers we sold. It's modern. Some change is good; we'll slowly implement those things.

Nothing happens over night. It's not like one day you walk in, and everything's changed—slowly. We're looking into add-ons for our POS system which will augment our software using technology that will allow our staff to recognize members when they walk in and address them by name, knowing their family, we can more easily relate to them as individuals, as members of the Club.

The "Jonas" system needs to be updated, it will include handhelds so that member orders can be taken tableside. The order is in the kitchen before your server even leaves the table. We're also looking at performers and the variety of acts in addition to those that already perform here. It's amazing how much talent is out there.

In short, it's a tightrope! We're making progress—staytuned.
