
Tiki, Grill, or Main Dining room? The tiki! Being outside is more our speed.

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The CYC Board of Directors (BOD) met on November 16. The following items were addressed:

- The Finance committee presented the proposed budget for next year, incorporating the many things that have increased significantly over the past year – insurance, electric, minimum wage. The Board approved the proposed budget which will be forwarded to the Board of Trustees for their review as well.
- The Board approved a Winter membership and a Trial Membership. Let's be sure to welcome Jeff Covington and the Brunner's! The board also approved a change from Trial to Winter and a reduction from full to social. Unfortunately, we also had 7 resignations (3 Social, 3 Full and one LOA).
- In an email vote, the Board approved a House Policy change to the former Gull's Nest nomenclature and usage: The Board Room is maintained for use of Club boards, committees, and groups. Use of the Board Room is coordinated via the General Manager.
- The Dumbwaiter has been having some maintenance issues and is frequently down. The Board approved \$9000 to facilitate complete repairs. Especially considering our newly refurbished Drydock, it should get lots of use!
- The Cruisers report that they are again selling Bricks for around the flagpole. The brick with your names on it is \$100. An additional brick with your boat name is \$75. In addition, the Cruisers are supporting the Boys & Girls Club at Ridgecrest with a virtual Giving Tree. There will be a breakfast at the club on December 16th and Santa will present the (Cruiser purchased) gifts to the children.

The next meeting will be held on January 18 at 6 pm. Please note that all committee and Board meetings are open to the membership.

havoc on CYC on August 29, inundating our first floor with floodwaters. Despite the initial challenges, we embraced the opportunity to transform adversity into innovation. In the aftermath, a collective effort unfolded, resulting in a revitalized space that now boasts a renovated ground floor, including a brand-new Board Room, Dry Dock, and Member Lounge.

The decision was made to move the Accounting Office upstairs. This change not only addressed the immediate issue but sparked a broader vision for a reimagined club space. With the Board Room now relocated, the groundwork was laid for an exciting transformation. Members engaged in a collaborative brainstorming process to conceptualize the revamped spaces. also available for rental by members during sporting events and social gatherings. Stepping into the lounge reveals a fresh ambiance, complete with new furnishings and two expansive large-screen TVs.

Hurricane Idalia may have tested the foundations of CYC, but it was met with a spirit of resilience and innovation. The renovated ground floor stands as a testament to the club's ability to turn challenges into opportunities. THE FCYC DIRECTORS meeting was held on November 11th at St. Andrews Bay Yacht Club and was attended by Jim Coats via Zoom.

Significant topics of discussion consisted of forming an FCYC group insurance program, reciprocity matters, developing an FCYC Cruising Guide, expanding FCYC membership and FCYC club updates. Thus far it appears there are enough clubs that have an interest in participating in a group insurance program. FCYC has retained a consultant to assist in this endeavor. Interested clubs have been asked to provide information for the consultant. Phil Shaw and the CYC staff have submitted a great deal of information. Many clubs are in dire straits regarding club insurance. They either can't get insurance or it is cost prohibitive.

There continue to be issues with some FCYC clubs not emphasizing the importance of communication flow from management to lower staff levels when it comes to how reciprocity works. For instance, dining reservations for visiting club members, transient docking, up charging visiting club members for meals and beverages, and making visiting members feel welcome. It was noted at a recent meeting "the importance of reciprocity as it is a pillar of our organization".

FCYC has nearly completed a Cruising Guide for all FCYC clubs. The Cruising Guide provides a great deal of information about the clubs and nearby amenities.

Several non-FCYC clubs have applied for FCYC membership, however none of the applicants meet FCYC membership criteria. Coconut Grove Sailing Club and Miami Yacht Club have applied for FCYC membership and are currently under review.

Before making plans to visit any FCYC club, it is recommended to check with that club as many are remodeling buildings and marinas or going through repairs from storm damage.

Tom Pace, Past Commodore and current Race Chairman of the Pensacola Yacht Club, gave a presentation regarding a movement to host the America's Cup Race in Pensacola in the future.

Sad to report for those that don't already know, the St. Andrews Bay Yacht Club was destroyed by fire early Sunday morning following the FCYC Directors meeting.

CYC is scheduled to host an FCYC Directors meeting in November of 2025.

The next FCYC Directors meeting is scheduled for January 13, 2024 at Halifax River Yacht Club.




