We have the power to seek the common good.


A New Year has begun and as every sailor knows, "We do not have the power to change the wind, but we do have the power to adjust our course and trim our sails."

The Gulls 2024 Dues in the amount of \$25.00 are now being collected and are for the January through December 2024 fiscal year.





the monthly Compass, daily e-mail messages, and social media.



I hope everyone enjoyed their holidays and New Year. It was an eventful December with all the holiday parties, boat parade and new chef. We are going into the New






