## BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The BOD took the following actions at the January 19 meeting:

The Board approved some changes to Club Policy which will be posted for member review. Look for the specific language in emails and the Compass.

- House Rules section 3 with the Heading Members'
  Families will be amended to require children under
  the age of 18 to be accompanied and supervised by
  a guardian or responsible adult. This will be
  enforced throughout the clubhouse, including the
  new Member lounge as well as the pool area.
- To address an issue with Members reserving space at Club Events and failing to attend without cancelling the reservation, the Club will be charging 75% of the advertised price, times the number of persons in the reservation.
- The prohibition for persons under the age of 21 sitting at the Grille Bar is amended to include all Club Bars (The Grille, The Tiki, and in the Drydock.)
- The Board approved Secretary Carey Sauer as the Communications Committee Chair. The committee is looking for members to help develop better communication at the Club!

Our 2024 Waterside Committee comprises Chairman – John Minton, Rear Commodore

Rod White, Jim Coats, PC Greg Garner, Evelyn Garner, Don Reynolds, Dick & Phyllis Nordman, Guy Kreps, and Steve Hitchcock—your voting members. Feel free to discuss any marina issues throughout the year with any of these individuals for resolution.

In this month's meeting, we agreed to explore installing a pump-out system, with Guy Kreps leading the effort. Meetings with contractors are underway for project quotes. Federal Government funding of up to 75% raises hopes for Board of Directors and Trustees approval.

We also addressed slip holders purchasing deck mats to prevent slips and falls, considering the slippery nature of our new decking. Additional signage and the possibility for slip holders to access security cameras via their cell phones are being explored. Security gates will return to the agenda after the final electric installation is complete.

Stay tuned for updates on these projects, and by next month, a new electrical contractor will be chosen, marking progress in the final phase of installation. It's shaping up to be another busy year for the Waterside Committee, and we're pleased to announce that we've received our marina permit from the City of Clearwater!

#### **Happy Valentine's Day**

"What the world needs now, is love, sweet love; it's the only thing that there's just too little of."

Jackie DeShanon's hit song still resonates today, but long before it topped the charts in 1965, Valentine's Day spread the good news of love in the hearts and homes of the western world.



While there are several traditions surrounding the origins of Valentine's Day, many trace it back to one of the early martyrs of the Christian Church, Valentine of Rome. This Valentine was a priest who devoted his life to helping soldiers and caring for those in prison. While little is known concerning the details of his life, the story goes that in 296 AD, he was arrested because of his faith, and during his trial, he healed the

blind daughter of the judge who was trying the case. Shortly before his death, he sent the young girl whose sight had been restored a farewell note of encouragement and signed it "Your Valentine." Pope Gelasius the First set the date of February 14th as St Valentine's Day in the year 496, and over the course of many centuries that day continues the custom of sharing "Valentines" notes and gifts with those we love.

However, I suspect that if the real St Valentine were among us today, then perhaps he would encourage us to listen once again to the words sung by Jackie DeShannon back in 1965 because St Valentine's life of love was never limited to once a year. According to legend, he was arrested and put to death. Not because of a single act of love, but because of a lifetime of compassion and mercy directed not merely towards those he held most dear, but to the poor, prisoners, strangers, and all those in need of hope, healing, compassion, and love.

This Valentine's Day might be a good time to remember that what the world needs now might not simply be another box of chocolates, a night out on the town, or a Hallmark Card. "What the world needs now is love... No not just for some, but for everyone;" and the gifts of love we may all be most in

need of are the ones that truly come from the heart: words of kindness, acts of mercy and generosity, gestures of patience,



a willingness to listen, and a readiness to forgive. These are the lasting gifts which lie at the very heart of St Valentine's Day, and then as now, they have the potential to bring hope and healing our way, and in so doing to change the world for good.

- **7.** Sparking interest for consumer events such as meetings and banquets to be held in a ballroom that can accommodate 350 people.
- **8.** Next event is "Jazz by the Bay," a Mardi Gras type event set for Saturday, February 17, 2024. Tickets are on sale.
  - 9. Volunteers are needed for all areas of the Aquarium.
- **10.** Future include a hotel (space available next to the Manatee Rescue Center).

Before joining FOX13 in 2015, he worked at TV stations in Philadelphia, PA, Greenville-Spartanburg, SC, and Panama City, FL.


Mr. Cato is the curator of "Only in Florida" and will present amusing and interesting video clips followed by a Q&A Session.

**THE FCYC JANUARY** 13th Directors meeting was held at Halifax River Yacht Club in Daytona Beach.

The FCYC 2024 budget was submitted and approved. John Timmel of Tampa Yacht Club advised the group insurance concept seems viable. Joy Roesner, Executive Director of FICURMA, advised a London Insurance underwriter has expressed interest in the FCYC group insurance coverage. Joy Roesner stated FCYC members participating in the group Insurance coverage could experience a thirty to fifty percent reduction in premiums. Joy stated the London insurance company highly recommends updated club appraisals and the appraisals be done by the same appraisal company to have a base line for market analysis. Joy stated she is aware of an appraisal company that would offer a discounted fee. No pricing for the appraisal is available yet. Currently fourteen yacht clubs have provided the necessary information to move forward with the group insurance program. Three or four other yacht clubs have an interest but are slow to provide the necessary information. John Timmel feels additional yacht clubs will participate once they learn of the potential savings. The goal is to have new insurance coverage available prior to hurricane season.

I mentioned in my last report the St. Andrews Bay Yacht Club was destroyed due to a fire. The FCYC Director from St. Andrews Bay Yacht Club asked FCYC Clubs to donate a club burgee to St. Andrews Bay. I hand delivered a CYC burgee at the FCYC meeting.

There was a discussion regarding a couple clubs still violating FCYC reciprocity standards which will be addressed by the FCYC Executive committee.

Reminder for yacht club Fleet Captains to submit Cruising Logs to FCYC for annual FCYC cruising awards.

CYC members please notice that effective immediately, Royal Palm Yacht & Country Club (RPY&CC) has withdrawn its membership in the Florida Council of Yacht Clubs. Any reservations that are currently active at RPY&CC will be honored.

## POLICIES UPDATES

**AT A RECENT** Policy Meeting and subsequently voted by the Board of Directors, the following policies have been approved and adopted:

#### **House Rules**

#### **OLD POLICY**

#3 Parents shall be responsible for the conduct of their children on club property except when participating in a sanctioned Club Youth function. Children under the age of 12 shall not be permitted in the clubhouse or in the pool area unless accompanied by a parent or a responsible individual over the age of 16.

#### **NEW POLICY**

#3 Parents shall be responsible for the conduct of their children on club property except when participating in a sanctioned Club Youth function. Children under the age of 18 shall not be permitted in the clubhouse or in the pool area unless accompanied by a parent or a responsible adult.

#### **OLD POLICY**

# 12 Members shall be charged for un-cancelled reservations to special Club functions unless the reservations are cancelled within the advertised cancellation policy period before the function involved. The charge shall be calculated as fifty percent (50%) of the advertised price multiplied by the number of people in the reservation.

#### **NEW POLICY**

# 1 2 Members shall be charged for un-cancelled reservations to special Club functions unless the reservations are cancelled within the advertised cancellation policy period before the function involved. The charge shall be calculated as seventy five percent (75%) of the advertised price multiplied by the number of people in the reservation.

#### **OLD POLICY**

#20 Grille Room
Persons under the age of 21 years may sit at tables in the Grille Room but are not permitted to sit at the bar.

#### **NEW POLICY**

#20 Club Bars
Persons under the age of 21 years may sit at tables but are not permitted to sit at the bars.
