BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The BOD took the following actions at the February 15 meeting:

The Board approved several items including:

- Approval for the Membership Committee to move ahead with their WINBACK and UPGRADE campaigns.
- Approval for up for \$45,000 for the completion of the parking resurface and the pergola and furniture in place of Jack's tree.
- Approval to extend temporary Member status to Regatta participants March 8-10 which allows them to pay with a credit card.
- Approval of the Long-Term Planning Committee Members: Mary Kay Delk as Chair; Keegan Pennycuff and Wayne Huneke as continuing members; and Steve Eckovich and Steve Hitchcock as re-upped members.
- Approval of the Members of the Leadership Development Committee: John Minton, Richie Shaw, Phyllis Nordman, and Rick Broom.
- Approval of three new members (one Trial, two Winter); a rejoined Junior member and an upgrade from Social to Full. We also have seven resignations and four leave of absences (two extensions and two new).
 Please make our new members welcome. New Members – remember to ask for your new member flag to help our veteran members find you!

Other discussions highlighted some new additions to the Club: The new, big TVs in the Drydock provided a great venue

for the Superbowl which had the largest crowd ever. Some of the TVs are also set up to allow both PCs and MACs to connect easily for photo sharing and presentations.

The Charthouse next door is slated for demolition shortly. Fears about pile driving have been allayed as they will be augering in the pilings instead. Please do not address questions / concerns to the workers directly – route them through the Bridge or the Club office.

GREETINGS FROM NORTH OF THE SEA WALL!

Our Waterside Committee continues to make progress in gathering quotes for

installing a pump-out system in our marina. We aim to present our findings and recommendations to the Board of Directors during their March meeting.

This month, Mike Sauer attended our Waterside Committee meeting to present his proposal for installing underwater lights in our marina. Prior to the meeting we conducted a vote among our slip holders who voted overwhelmingly to support moving forward with the project. The project was approved by the committee. The Cruiser Club will be the primary funding source, supplemented by generous contributions from some of our members.

Our security camera provider has enabled us to offer access to the marina cameras for our slip holders who desire it. We are currently in the process of installing one access point per slip, when requested.

Additionally, we are urging our slip holders to consider purchasing dock mats for use when staying on their boats in the marina. Recent observations have shown that our new dock can become slippery when wet. We strongly encourage the use of these mats for safer boarding and exiting of boats in the marina.

Lastly, Erwin Electric was awarded our contract to complete the final phase of our marina renovation project. They are currently in the permitting phase and as soon as it is approved by the City of Clearwater they will begin work.





sheets at all. You can't win if you don't play.



IN LIKE A LION AND OUT LIKE A LAMB...

MARCH IS LIVINGup to its name this year. Linked so closely with the shortest month of the year (February) it is, indeed, a month that "marches forward" from the remnants of winter to the promise of a return to the warmth (heat and humidity) for which the Sunshine State is famous. However, there is another aspect to March which is especially promising for us this year and that is the blessings of inspiration and hope because for us at CYC, March will also include St. Patrick's Day, the Commodore's Ball, and Easter.

The Commodore's Ball honors those CYC members who have placed their time and talent in service to CYC and done so "at the helm" where the course has always required a stable and experienced hand capable of inspiring our members and guiding us through the dangerous lee shores of financial and, at times, seemingly countless challenges. Things didn't always go smoothly, and many failures would lie ahead for Ireland, but Patrick's approach has always been there for them and for us, summoning "the better angels" of our humanity. His example is never about the quick fix or easy answers to complex questions, but it is the "way" that flows from the "Lamb" whose Easter triumph over evil and death Christians will celebrate this year on the final day of March.

Yes, March comes in like the lion and goes out with the Lamb, and we are blessed to remember those whose lives and labors continue to inspire us in the present and give us hope for the days to come.


