## **BOARD HIGHLIGHTS**

The BOD took the following actions at the March 21 meeting:

The Board approved several items including:

- The Long-Term Planning Committee report was presented to the Board. The LTPC is recommending the creation of a new, larger Tiki bar and some building modifications that would allow for more seating inside, consolidating the offices together and a deck accessed from the Grille. After some discussion it was concluded that the Committee would proceed to generate more detailed information before the May meeting.
- The Board approved an additional \$2300 for lights atop the new pedestals at the entrances. It also pays for an additional license plate camera and the landscaping around the bases of the pedestals.
- The new Membership campaigns have been successful, despite some issues with the emails reaching the intended recipients. The Upgrade program resulted in six movements from Social to Full members. The Winback program saw two former members rejoin us. Once the new server is in place, the Winback emails will be sent again. Overall, we have a net increase of six new members this month!

## **GREETINGS FROM NORTH**OF THE SEA WALL!


The pump out project led by Guy Kreps continues to make good progress. Guy has

received two bids by the primary companies who install these systems throughout Florida. Price discussions are ongoing, and we are hoping to reach a final recommendation over the next 30 days.

We are beginning the administrative task of applying for the Federal grant that pays 75% of the project and is managed by the State of Florida. The application process is a tedious one, but members of the Waterside Committee are prepared to get it done. The timing on the overall project is contingent on completing the docks and before the parking lot is resurfaced.

Regarding the marina our contractor, Erwin Electric has been proceeding through the permitting process with the City of Clearwater. We have run into a few snags in satisfying the city's requirements, but we feel rather strongly in our position. We are trying hard not to allow the desire to finish the project force us to agree with something that is over burdensome and costly to the club. Hopefully by next month's Compass we will have the work permit and will proceed with getting work started.

Recently we implemented a new contract amendment concerning slip holders' engagement with the Club. The desire of our leadership is that we don't have slip holders that use the marina as a place to simply store their boat and not support the Club. As many of you know we have quite a few very active members that have been waiting on slips for far too long. Additionally, our Waterside Committee promised to not allow members to park their boats to die in our marina. Lastly, we hope to have a vibrant marina with active boaters and a place we can be proud of.

The H & G committee is deep into the process of finding a flood mitigation system to protect our dry dock and clubhouse from flooding in the future. We should have specifics soon and a great resolution to this problem. We will keep you all informed as we proceed with this very important project.

As a friendly reminder, the campus of CYC is non-smoking. Smoking areas are designated at the west end of the marina near "C" dock. Seating will be installed as part of the new landscaping projects after the parking lot. The other area is the SW corner of the pool when people are not swimming and alternately, the SE corner of the building outside of the fence. This information can be found in our policy as well. From time to time, the BOD may approve other times when smoking is allowed at the Tiki area, outside. One example was after our Bourbon dinner at the end of March. Thank you all for respecting the club policy.
