
# GREETINGS FROM NORTH OF THE SEA WALL!

**GOOD NEWS!** Our application for installing the pump-out system to the State

of Florida has been submitted. We are hoping for a 30-day turnaround so we can get started. In the meantime, we will begin negotiating with contractors and be ready to start as soon as the project is approved. This project has reminded us how a few dedicated members can make a significant difference in our club when they invest their time and energy!

The electrical project continues to face delays due to additional obstacles from the City of Clearwater and FEMA. These issues are being addressed, but it takes time. We remain focused and are working to resolve them as quickly as possible. We still hope to begin work by early to mid-June.

Our marina is a busy place these days as folks contemplate their next boat moves. Currently, several boats are for sale. This will allow us to make some adjustments with existing slip holders and offer slips to members who have been on the waitlist for some time. Remember, the decision on who is offered a slip is based on matching boat sizes to slips and how active you are within our club. I'm happy to discuss how this works with anyone at any time. Lastly, it is important to remember that when selling your boat, your slip does not go with it. We will expect the slip to be vacated within days of the final sale.






