


The Board of Directors held an abbreviated meeting in April before moving into a closed Executive Session.

• The pump out system spearheaded by the Waterside Committee continues to move forward. The total cost of a pump out system will be \$75,000-\$80,000. The cost borne by CYC is around \$20,000 with the balance covered by the State of Florida. The Board approved the expenditure of \$20,000 and supports Waterside's recommended contractor and submission of the package to the State.




GREETINGS FROM NORTH OF THE SEA WALL!



Many years ago, I led the Blessing of the Fleet at a Yacht Club "up north." One of the members was a friend since childhood and had purchased a used sailboat. He was a newbie when it came to his knowledge of boat maintenance and basic coastal navigation.

Several weeks later, my friend called me with the sad news that his boat had sustained serious damage when, during a nighttime return to the entrance to our harbor, he mistook the jetty lights for the correct entrance marker into the harbor which was located approximately a half nautical mile further north. The result of this was that he ended up stranded on the rocks rather than completing a safe passage into the harbor. Fortunately, it was a calm night and there were no injuries to those onboard. "What happened to the blessing, Fr Bob?! I thought this was supposed to keep me safe on the water."

While I felt sorry for his misfortune, I reminded him that part of the blessing involved these words: "may this vessel always be operated in accordance with prudent seamanship and sound navigation...."

Blessings are not magic; and when it comes to Blessings of Boats, they require something on our part by way of a response, reminding us that when it comes to living-into the blessing, "prudent seamanship and sound navigation" remain the responsibility of the captain of every vessel underway. Venturing out on the water at any time always requires nothing less. Captains are required to exercise careful navigation when it comes to understanding and complying with our sailor's Bible, "COLREGS" and this includes the meaning and location of all aids to navigation. This becomes even more critical at night when it comes to the location and meaning of Lighted Aids to Navigation.

This month, I write to urge all our members to "know before you go" and always operate our vessels as "prudent

mariners" when it comes to knowing the meaning and locations of all Aids to Navigation and frequent updates concerning these are available through weekly "Notice to Mariners." These are essential to ensure a safe passage especially on coastal waters and at the entrances to inlets and channels.

Clearwater Pass and the markers defining the Intracoastal Waterway verses Jetty Markers and the Entrance Markers into Clearwater Harbor, combined with the many lights onshore from large buildings and other vessels can be confusing to those unfamiliar with the confluence of channels and the location of jetties and shoaling areas we will encounter. Frequent strong currents can quickly cause a vessel to be rapidly moved outside a safe channel even though a channel marker appears to be "straight ahead." Keep track of every channel maker you pass and then sight back to that marker and sight ahead to the next one and use the two as "range markers" to ensure you remain in safe water. Remember, the marker ahead will always appear to be straight ahead even after we've been pushed outside the channel.) This is not only true during daylight but especially important during the hours of darkness and limited visibility.

The blessing remains, and our task remains, as well, which is to ensure that we do our utmost to live-out the blessing every time we get underway: "Heavenly Father, we ask you to bless all the boats belonging to members of CYC, and all who sail in them. May our boats always be operated in accordance with prudent seamanship, navigation, and the best traditions of the sea; so that all onboard may always arrive in peace at the harbors of refuge they are bound for."

May such blessings be yours throughout all the days to come. Have fun.... but stay safe.


