FCYC Update

THE MAY FCYC meeting was hosted by the Marathon Yacht Club.

Proposed revised FCYC By-Laws were made available for review and comments by FCYC members.

Government Affairs Committee reported the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has proposed to expand the area of an existing 10-knotper hour speed limit to a much larger area of the East Coast waters to protect the endangered North Atlantic Right Whales. The proposal would include all boats 35 feet and longer.

A FCYC informational tri- fold was provided and will be available to CYC members.

FCYC Commodore announced the first FCYC Newsletter supported by an on-link is ready to be distributed to all member clubs.

The FCYC Group Insurance Committee reported that the original concept to join the FICURMA Insurance Group is no longer being considered due to legal restrictions. A consultant has been retained and the committee is lining up legislators to sponsor legislation that would allow FCYC to have a group insurance program.

Others at the yacht club can also attest first hand to the benefits of life saving devices. Last month at a CYC Sunday brunch, a member was choking on a piece of food. Six different people attempted the Heimlich maneuver to no avail. Thanks to the quick thinking and actions of our GM, Peter Jutis,

who's years of restaurant experience led him to buying and knowing how to use a de-choking device, called a LifeVac, the event was over before the paramedics arrived. The member's ribs were a little bruised but they have made a full recovery and will live to



dine with us another day. Thank you, Peter!

Did you know?

The club has defibrillators and CPR resuscitation bags on each floor but in light of this recent scare, we are doing a number of additional things to be proactive. Recently an outside company came in to teach the staff CPR and how to operate the defibrillators and LifeVacs. Another is inserting a LifeVac in each of the defibrillator boxes. There are other LifeVacs in and around the club and if any member would like to learn how to use them, just ask Peter. Next steps include allocating funds to procure additional life saving equipment and training on food safety.


HOUSE and GROUNDS

SUMMERTIME ACROSS THE United States is a busy sailing season, and this year is no exception. In fact, with the upcoming Olympics and many long distance offshore races such as the Newport to Bermuda – the Summer of "24 is one for the memories.

Let's start with Yachting. After our busy winter racing season in February and March, we are now planning for the 2025 season. We have a strategy in place, influenced by macro level activities in the broader sailing community, to ensure Clearwater Yacht Club is on the map. As I mentioned in past months, CYC has the proverbial "real estate" with the location to position the Club as a Nationally recognized offshore sailing venue. Big boat, or keelboat racing, is making a comeback in Florida, with the New York Yacht Club investing many millions of dollars in Pensacola in support of the Americas Cup campaign. Other currents, such as our partnership with SPYC on the Offshore Series, portend bigger opportunities as our area evolves, into a destination for East Coast and Midwest sailing money.

More importantly, the Olympics in July will host a sailing

venue in Marseille France whose scenery is epic and whose waters are challenging. Clearwater is a cradle of Olympians – most recently Brad Kendall sailed to Silver in 2016. 2024 is no different as Noah Ryan, sailing the ultra cool windsurfing foils, has the credential to do well at the Olympics. Yachting hosted an event in late June to raise money for Noah's "Path to Paris". The Friday night event was packed and the

of his life and that he was ready to move on to competitive sailing. Rich White was at that time the director of the Clearwater Community Sailing Center and a good friend. He welcomed Noah into his program and before long, Noah was competing in Optis and 420s. In

his free time, he volunteered with our program, as well. During summer camp, Noah volunteered as a Boatswain, Midshipman, Watch Captain, and eventually assisting with the development of a small Opti Team and 420 Team once we moved our program to CYC. Learning what it means to "pay it forward" was a guiding principle for us, and Noah had clearly learned this lesson well.

Before long, Noah was determined to become a "full-time" competitive sailor. His dream was either to crew on an America's Cup boat, or else to pursue a place on the US Olympic Sailing Team. It is impossible for me to understate the degree of determination and perseverance that Noah exhibited! His training continued and


