



House and Grounds

GREETINGS FROM NORTH OF THE SEA WALL!

Great news! We received approval from the State of Florida to put a pump out

system in our marina. They will pay 75% of the completed project. We hope to get the project underway in the next 30 to 45 days. Again, a big thank you to Guy Kreps for leading the charge and Evelyn Garner for assisting in completing the tedious state application forms!

In the coming months our Dock Master will be leading the charge to get our marina designated as Clean Marina by the State of Florida. The Clean Marina Program (CMP) is a voluntary designation program that encourages marina facilities to incorporate the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's environmental Best Management Practices (BMPs), which exceed regulatory requirements. More to come.





Over the past several weeks, we have had movement in the marina that allowed us to move some folks from the wait list to a slip. In doing so the questions always come how decisions are made regarding who gets a slip. First, the Dockmaster and Fleet Captain determine the optimum size boat for the slip that is available. Then we go to the waitlist and pick the four boats of that size or close to it that best fit in that slip. (We try hard to not put a boat that is too big or too small for the available slip.) Once we identify those boats, we review club spending of the four boat owners and involvement in the club. If one of the members is very active compared to the others both spending and involvement, they are awarded the slip. In the case of a tie, or the members are all close, time on the wait list is the tie breaker.

With this movement the wait list has reduced and it's a good time to get your name on the list. Please contact Michele Geis CYC Controller to complete an application to be added to the wait list. Brice will be calling and updating the list every 6 months to see if any changes need to be made to ensure the list remains up to date.





No early boats depart on Sunday so more time to kick around Key West waiting for the evening ferry back to Ft. Myers. A few cruisers were caught snoozing their way back








